

Technical Visits

On Friday October 12, 2007, conference delegates have the possibility to visit one of the 3 following state-of-the-art water reuse facilities:

- (1) The IWVA artificial groundwater recharge plant (Wulpen): prevention of saline water intrusion and production of potable water
- (2) The BioEnergy food processing plant (Lommel): conversion of food processing by-products into reclaimed water for boiler feed water and steam, green electricity and a biological fertilizer
- (3) The Evides industry Water Deco plant (Terneuzen): production of demineralised water from six different water resources and production of cooling water for the Dow Benelux chemical plant

Social activities

The conference offers an attractive social programme both for conference delegates and accompanying persons. The gala dinner will be held in the unique Grand Café Horta in the historic centre of Antwerp.

Venue and host city

The conference will be held in Antwerp, Belgium, in the Flanders Congress and Concert centre near the Central station and the historic city centre. The city is half an hour by train from Brussels international airport and only two hours travel from London, Paris and Amsterdam.

Wastewater reuse and reclamation: a rapidly evolving sector

Reclaimed water is of fundamental importance to our environment and economy and no longer restricted to water scarce areas. Planned, more direct use of reclaimed water contributes to an efficient and more reliable use of the water resources. The water sector is in a transitional phase with unique opportunities for water reclamation and reuse to be implemented on a larger scale as a sustainable practice in a framework of **integrated water management**.

Global platform

Over the years, this biennial IWA water reuse conference has become a major global platform for sharing best practice and discussing the latest developments in the field of sustainable reuse of **municipal and industrial** wastewater. An appointment not to be missed by research institutions, companies and organisations active in this sector, both in developed and developing countries. Thanks to the large interest for the conference and response from 50 countries to the call for abstracts we are able to present an excellent scientific programme, including **200 oral presentations, 3 poster sessions, 5 workshops** and **3 technical visits**.

Oral and poster sessions

The oral presentations are distributed over 36 sessions, covering all aspects of water reuse and representing **science, policy** and **practice**. Six sessions will be dedicated to water recycling within the industry. Each day will highlight a poster session allowing discussion with the authors.

Workshops

Five workshops will allow the conference delegates to debate the latest progress on the following key issues:

- (1) European experience and priorities
- (2) Priority compounds in indirect potable water reuse
- (3) Artificial groundwater recharge
- (4) WHO 2006 water reuse guidelines
- (5) Industrial water recycling
